Whether you are an older adult, you work or care for



Zion Lutheran Food Drive Results

During confirmation Bob and I were talking about service projects through one of the assignments I completed. Bob encouraged me to do a service project during Lent. I decided to collect food for the Manna food pantry in Worthington. Since my confirmation class is small, I decided to have all the youth of Zion collect food. I put a box in church for donations and was also taking money to be donated. The church Council voted to donate half of the Lent offering to this.

In total the church collected 54.5 pounds of food and \$246.50 that was donated to the "Manna Food Pantry" in Worthington, MN. This happened to be a good time to collect money for the food pantry because the Worthington Regional Health Care Foundation was matching funds dollar for dollar. Also, the Greater MN Council of Churches was matching 3% of donations. Donations from GMCC were matched with product and money. So, with the matches, that means that we actually donated: 56.1 pounds of food and \$500.40 with all the matches.

Thank you everyone for participating in the food drive. When I was donating the food at the pantry, a worker told me that many times those that have the least actually donate the most because they know what it is like not to have much and they don't want other people to feel that way. Donating to the food pantry made me feel good because I saw people at the food pantry gathering food that don't have all that I have. I think that God has a reason for why some people don't have as much as others, maybe it's God's way of showing some people how good they actually have it.

Thank you for all that you did to help me support the Manna Food Pantry.

New Business:


- Flooring has been purchased for the basement bathrooms. Randy is going to check into prices for vanity and the walls.

This Mother's Day, make a bright gift for someone special in your life.



- Cardstock
- Tape
- Mason jar
- Primer paint
- Acrylic paint (3 colors)
- Paintbrushes
- Battery-operated tea light
- Paper and pen
- Hole punch
- Twine

What you do:

- 1. Cut out two cardstock hearts and tape them to the jar sides, near the bottom.
- 2. Paint the entire jar with primer paint. Let dry.
- 3. Paint splotches of acrylic paint over the primer. Let dry. Remove the heart shapes.
- 4. Place the tea light in the jar.
- 5. Write a note that says, "Mom, you're the light of my life!" Punch a hole in one corner of the note, thread twine through the hole and tie the note around the jar's neck.
